TELL US YOUR STORY SERIES:

We honor James Thomas and his 90 years membership at Christ Episcopal Church Xenia.

James Augustus Thomas is from one of the pillar families of Christ Episcopal Church Xenia. His grandparents, Montague Augustus Bailey and Sarah Wooten Bailey moved from England to Xenia, Ohio with their three daughters and four sons before 1906. The Baileys donated money for many of the pews in the church and helped fund the construction of the stone building we have today. They also paid for the baptismal font, donated gold plaques to be placed on the pews, and donated money for the stained glass windows that once adorned this church. The gold plaques unfortunately were stolen before they could be mounted. The tornado in 1974 destroyed most of the stained glass windows.

James' mother, Phyllis Bailey, was 10 when they arrived in Xenia. She married Marshall Thomas. They

had five children: Kenneth, James, Phyllis, Vernon, and Fred. Kenneth died of a brain hemorrhage when he was young. Phyllis married William Greathouse. Vernon married Sue. Fred married Violetta.

James was born December 20, 1920. He was baptized at Christ Church on February 27, 1921. He was confirmed at Christ Church on Easter, April 21, 1935. He graduated from Xenia Central High School in 1939, where he had ran track and played football. He served his country in the Navy on the USS Bennington for 18 months. He married Harriet Faye on August 9, 1947 at Mount Zion Church. He was employed at Wright Patterson Air Force Base, where he lost eyesight in an eye to an explosion.

James and Faye have three sons: Doug, Mark, and Tom; and one daughter, Robin. They have four grandsons, two granddaughters, and two great-grandsons.

Consequently, to tie in the family connections, Phyllis Bailey Thomas' sister Gladys married Marshall Taylor and had Elsie, making Elsie Jim's cousin. Elsie married into the Nichol family and it is from that pair that we receive the Nichol trust.

Health and safety

I was sick recently: sore throat, cough, and fever. I can't be sure, but I think it was caused by too much kissing the week before.

Commonly people "kiss" here when greeting one another. "Kiss" in this context means touching cheeks and kissing the air (everybody does it, except of course men-greeting-men in this macho society).

Last week I attended a series of meetings with the community health promoters, offering a multitude of great opportunities to exchange ideas, thoughts, and germs. Everyone greets everyone else individually. Even if the meeting has already started, it stops while the late-comer greets each person there (a little tiresome to me when it is the sixth late-comer within fifteen minutes) - and, of course, everything said in the meeting up to that point has to be repeated so that everyone is included. I like the sentiment and inclusiveness, but the delays drive me a little bit crazy. At any rate, there has been a lot of respiratory illness in the communities recently and ... well, I ended up sick.

Our prayer requests have always asked people to pray for our health and safety. My recent sore throat not-with-standing, we have been incredibly healthy over the years - especially considering all the relatively greater risks posed by infections and accidents here.

Michael was waiting alone in a small community in the sugar cane fields one day. A young, barefoot, unwashed boy approached him with a cluster of grapes and offered to share them. Michael smiled and said in English, "You're the little guy that always has diarrhea." Thanks to unanticipated English-Spanish cognates, the boy surprised Michael and answered, "Si, ¡yo tengo diarrhea! ¿Quieres una uva?" Michael said a little prayer, and they split the grapes. Michael was fine.

Prayers for health and safety work. Thanks and keep up the good work.

face huge challenges in finding jobs through which they can legally support themselves and their children. Please pray for all the lawyers and church people advocating for promising initiatives in criminal justice reform to reduce recidivism.

ECSF just received this wonderful success story from Jonathan Youngman at Franklinton Cycle Works in Columbus, one of our new grantees:

In the Spring of 2009 the partners at Franklinton Cycle Works met Charles at a St. John's Street Church service in Columbus. Charles is middle-aged, of mixed race, and a lifelong West Side resident who is active in neighborhood ministries. As an ex-offender, he faced many barriers to getting a job until finally he was hired for a shift beginning at 3 a.m. But he had no car and Columbus buses didn't start running early enough for Charles to arrive to work on time. We offered to fix up a bike for Charles, he chose a mountain bike from our stock, we made sure it was reliable and safe, and he began biking to work. In March Charles secured a more permanent job within the neighborhood doing maintenance at a hotel in exchange for housing. He still uses his bicycle to run errands and see family nearby. Most importantly, Charles has asked to donate his time as a shop volunteer and share his story with the at-risk youth at the bicycle shop about the dangers of gang life and the difficulties he has experienced as an ex-offender.
