Enigma

Where there is no vision, the people perish: but he that keepeth the law, happy is he. Proverbs 29:18

In spite of those who have disregarded the Revelation of Jesus the Messiah as confided to John the aged apostle, the said revelation has marked the closure of the canonical scriptures; And in these closing times of the Days of Grace, the note of triumph silences the gloomy predictions of the prophets of doom.

To those whose hope is built on nothing less than Jesus blood and righteousness, the Book of Revelation is the vision of a renewed earth wherein those who have kept faith in the Eternal God will people earth and heaven and enjoy unremitting bliss: the Lion will lie down with the Lamb and they shall not hurt nor destroy in the Holy dominion of God.

I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end, the first and the last. Blessed are they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city. For without are dogs, and sorcerers, and whoremongers, and murderers, and idolators, and whosoever loveth and maketh a lie. I Jesus have sent mine angel to testify unto you these things in the churches. I am the root and the offspring of David, and the bright and morning star. And the Spirit and the bride say, Come. And let him that heareth say, Come. And let him that is athirst come. And whosoever will, let him take the water of life freely.

For I testify unto every man that heareth the words of the prophecy of this book. If any man shall add unto these things, God shall add unto him the plagues that are written in this book. And if any man shall take away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part out of the book of life, and out of the holy city, and from the things which are written in this book.

He who testifieth these things saith, Surely I come quickly. Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. Amen. Revelations 22 13-21

The penultimate warning will remind those familiar with the Gospel of our Saviour's admonition relative to the superlative expediency of those engaged in the work of ministry.

Woe unto thee, Chorazin! Woe unto thee, Bethsaida! For if the mighty works had been done in Tyre and Sidon, which have been done in you, they had a great while ago repented, sitting in sackcloth and ashes. But it shall be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon at the judgement, than for you. And thou, Capernaum, which art exalted to heaven, shalt be thrust down to hell. He that heareth you heareth me; and he that despiseth you despiseth me; and he that despiseth me, despiseth him that sent me.

And the seventy returned again with joy, saying, Lord, even the devils are subject unto us through thy name. And he said unto them, I beheld Satan as lightning fall from heaven. Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you.

Notwithstanding in this rejoice not, that the spirits are subject unto you; but rather rejoice, because your names are written in heaven.

In that hour Jesus rejoiced in spirit, and said, I thank thee, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that thou hast hid these things from the wise and prudent, and hast revealed them unto babes: even so, Father; for so it seemed good in thy sight. Luke 10:13-21

When the whole plan of man's redemption and the created universe is restored to its original status, then the wonder and glory of God's divine love will occasion the triumphant song of total redemption...



EXHIBIT OF HISTORIC ICONS

Representing more than five centuries of a unique artistic tradition, St. Paul, The Apostle Orthodox Church will host an exhibition of more than 100 icons, both ancient and modern, in its sanctuary, located at 4451 Wagner Road in Dayton, August 20 – 22, 2010. The exhibition is free and open to the public from 10 AM to 6 PM on Friday, August 20 and Saturday, August 21, and from 12- 5 PM on Sunday, August 22. Icons (from the Greek word “eikon” meaning “image”) are an ancient Christian artistic tradition dating from the time of the Apostles, aimed at communicating the Gospel visually. The historic icons will be surrounded by 36 large icons recently installed on the walls of St. Paul’s, commissioned by the parish from noted Russian-American iconographer Dmitri Shkolnik. The exhibition is part of the year-long 25th anniversary celebration of St. Paul the Apostle Orthodox Church, a parish of the Orthodox Church in America (OCA). The OCA one of 16 independent Churches (among them the Russian, Greek and Romanian Churches) that comprise the Eastern Orthodox Church. And I saw as it were a sea of glass mingled with fire: and them that had gotten the victory over the beast, and over his image, and over his mark, and over the number of his name, stand on the sea of glass, having the harps of God. And they sing the song of Moses the servant of God, and the song of the Lamb, saying, Great and marvelous are thy works, Lord God Almighty; just and true are thy ways,, Who shall not fear thee, O Lord, and glorify thy name? for though only art holy: for all nations shall come and worship before thee; for thy judgments are made manifest. Rev. 15:2-4

As the book of The Revelation of Jesus – the Son of God and Saviour – closes the canon of Holy Scripture the reader cannot but feel the consummation of History. There is no mention of the apostate denominationalism or of the spurious successors of the apostolate and domiciled in the thousand-roomed basilica of the Vatican of Saint Peter in a city called Rome – the scene of innumerable unchristian indictments leading to the torture and execution of Christian men, women, and young people.

Many scholars – and I share their conviction – that the dénouement of the *Whore of Babylon* is God’s final judgment upon the great LIE of HISTORY. The jubilation that such an historic apostasy has at long last come up for final judgment (in the words of scripture.. *never to be remembered forever!*) is a cause for joyous euphoria and *dafkah* from the noble Army of Martyrs thousands of whom were burned at the stake when a nod from the Pontiff would have won their release from such an obscene and dreadful fate.

On that great Day of Assize when all are arraigned for judgement, only those will be exonerated by virtue of their faithful trust in the redemptive work of the Lamb of God: their names are written down in the Lamb’s book of eternal life.

Jesus spake a parable touching upon the condition of acceptance at the marriage supper of the Lamb of God...

Then saith he to his servants, The wedding is ready, but they which were bidden were not worthy. Go ye therefore into the highways, and as many as ye shall find, bid to the marriage. So those servants went out into the highways, and gathered together all as many as they found, both bad and good: and the wedding was furnished with guests. And when the king came I to see the guests, he saw there a man which had not on a wedding garment: And he saith unto him, Friend, how camest thou in hither not having a wedding garment? And he was speechless. Then said the king to the servants, Bind him hand and foot, and take him away, and cast him into outer darkness; there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. For many called, but few are chosen. Matthew 22:8-14

The parable is perennially relevant. It was directed at those who chose to believe themselves above the ‘*common status*’ and to signal their superiority by a more choice garment. The King would have no such *nauvoux riche!* The very gesture of the gatecrasher was a tilt at the King – a gesture of *lésè majèsté*.

The resultant fate is a forewarning that to be called and chosen for such a banquet of grace it is imperative to be clothed in the King's garments of righteousness and to throw off ones sin-stained worldly garments and be obedient to the King's commandment.
