Share-One-to-One Clothes Closet

Every Tuesday in October we had 12-15 people waiting outside the doors of the Clothes Closet when we opened. We consistently have 25-45 people. Some new each week, others who are returning "clients". These people also get clothing for loved ones, friends or even residents of nursing homes who can't come in themselves. Our total number of people served often reaches nearly 60 counting these additional individuals.

At the clothes closet we try to give these individuals shoes, clothing, coats, bedding, hats, gloves, personal hygiene items, dishes, etc. We mostly rely on the community to donate these items to us. We also try to partner with other groups and direct the person in need to those groups.

You've heard about the couple who are living in a tent. He lost his job with a trucking company. They are homeless. We were able to give them two blankets, warm clothes, shoes, a small amount of food and contacts to help them with their other needs. Fortunately, it has not been extremely cold. They have found nighttime shelter in our emergency shelter.

We have been very blessed with donations, but we seem to always be in need of more women's extralarge, elementary and middle school age children's clothing is in short supply right now. With cold weather approaching we still need things like coats, hats, gloves and socks. Underwear - men's and women's - always fly out the door. Personal hygiene items rapidly disappear when we have any.

We really appreciate all those who have volunteered and those who donate items. We know God has good things planned for us (Jeremiah 29:11). Please pray for the clothes closet and the emergency shelter.





SAVIOR ORNAMENT

This Christmas, celebrate Jesus' birthday by making this keepsake ornament.

What you need:

- Wooden clothespin with round end
- Black permanent marker
- White cloth or felt
- Small wooden star (available at craft stores)
- Yellow paint
- Paintbrush
- Gold glitter (optional)
- Glue gun (and an adult)
- · Straw-colored raffia
- Palm-size wicker wreath (available at craft stores)
- Ribbon

What you do:

- On the clothespin's round knob, draw two dots for eves.
- 2. Wrap the white cloth around the clothespin, like a swaddled baby.
- 3. Paint the star yellow; add glitter, if desired.
- 4. With the glue gun and adult supervision, glue the raffia to the bottom inside of the wreath. Then glue the swaddled clothespin atop the raffia and glue the gold star atop the wreath.
- 5. Tie a ribbon around the top, near the star.
- 6. Hang the ornament on your Christmas tree or tie it on a gift.

Takin' out the trash

News cast in mid-September, 2011

"You are listening to the BBC World Service. Amidst the continuing fighting in Tripoli, regular garbage collection has resumed this morning. Garbage trucks with attendants in uniform are following their regular routes."

The worldview of the BBC may be a little bit different. As far as we could determine, no other international news service lead with that story (or even mentioned it). However, what better indication, perhaps, of a returning to normalcy in Tripoli, Libya, than the resumption of regular trash collection service?

There are some challenges living here (electric outages, general strikes, water shortages, crime, food and water borne disease, tropical diseases, mosquitos, corruption, etc.). However, our garbage collection has been excellent. We are in a middle-class neighborhood and Tuesday is our garbage day, with pickup almost always between 7:45 and 8:30 AM.

We were absolutely flabbergasted considering the general state of affairs.

This is all to say that it is generally recognized how important it is to take out the trash.

We met a Southern Baptist evangelist during our missionary preparation. He maintained that missionary service was more often adversely affected or devastated by hanging on to bad feelings, resentments, transgressions, frustrations, hurts and wounds than by anything else. Periodically you have to get rid of all that. Or as he said it, "You gotta stay 'fessed up!"

Whether formal or informal, reflection with a realistic appraisal and confession is a good idea. I suppose that we all got trash to take out.


