Father Arthur Ransome

Retired Reverend

That I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death; If by any means I might attain unto the resurrection of the dead. Not as though I had already attained, either were already perfect: but I follow after, If that I may apprehend that for which also I am apprehended of Christ Jesus.

Phillip 3:10-12

Saul the Tarsian –and now, following his dramatic conversion experience feels free to be known by the name of Paul – but he had not forgotten he had been in charge of the execution of the first Christian martyr Stephanus, who had died under a fusillade of stones thrown by Orthodox and Hellenist Jews at the place of stone, outside the walls of Jerusalem – The Holy City.

Paul's experience of conversing with the Risen and Exalted Jesus on the desert outskirts of Damascus and of the ethereal directive of the Son of God, Saul had, with blinded vision, been led to the house of one Ananias whereby he had secured the Death Penalty pronounced by the Jewish Sanhedrim in Jerusalem, was quick to point out this man's past record! But God is God who could affirm what great things this man would suffer in his life of Grace that had saved and revolutionized his future life for the Lord.

Paul was a Pharisee who at first hand had cause to bless the Grace offered by an offended God. The Lord knew this rabid persecutor would be a living symbol of the power of the crucified Jesus now risen from the tomb and exalted to

the Father's domain. How true are those words of a 20th century theologian who remarked like some visionary prophet: "The economy of undeserved Grace has primacy over the economy of moral deserts."

Paul was a trophy of what conversion is all about: I rejoice when I meet with like-minded believers who know, as I do, how one day we shall stand at the judgement seat of the Christ to learn of our adherence to the power of the Crucified Savior to cleanse the soul of sin, must know it is the one debarment that God cannot but uphold. God forefend a heavenly Paradise open to the wiles of Satan.

No amount of human reasoning can affect the purging of the soul as can the blood of God's Lamb.

Not all the blood of beasts
On Jewish Altars slain,
Could give the guilty conscience peace,
Or wash away its stain.
But Christ, God's heav'nly Lamb,
Takes all my sins away,
A sacrifice of nobler name,
And richer blood than they.

That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked upon, and our hands have handled, of the Word of life; (For the life was manifested, and we have seen it, and bear witness, and show unto you that eternal life, which was with the Father, and was manifested unto us;) That which we have seen and heard declare we unto you, that ye also may have fellowship with us: and truly our fellowship is with the Father, and with his Son, Jesus Christ.

And these things write we unto you, that your joy may be full. This then is the message which we have heard of him, and declare unto you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness, we lie, and do not tell the truth: But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin. If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

It is transparently clear that true believers in the Lord Christ Jesus have a new relationship and fellow ship with Him and with one another. If there is disparity in the oneness we share in the body of our Lord, it signifies a discord that the unsaved world uses as an excuse for their neglect of Jesus... An atheist declared publicly – "Christians need to act more saved if they want me to follow their savior."

<u>Fellowship</u> with JESUS presupposes we are mariners aboard the **same** ship and together with Christ who is guiding his vessel to the same have.

O! Halleluja, yes 'tis heaven-'tis heave to know my sins forgiv'n, On land or sea, what matters where, Where Jesus is 'tis heaven there.

Four Great Movies of Faith

Wed, June 2 THEY KILLED SISTER DOROTHY:

The 2008 documentary directed by Daniel Junge, about the trials of the men responsible for the murder of Daytonian, Sister Dorothy Stang, targeted for trying to save the Amazonian rainforest and help the peasants living in it. Remarkable for capturing the sense of entitlement of the powerful ranchers ultimately brought before the Brazilian courts for paying some poor men to shoot her.

Wednesday, July 7 DOUBT:

The 2008 film written and directed by Patrick Shaneley about a priest in a Catholic school suspected of pedophilia. The story raises questions about how to proceed when sexual abuse is suspected.

Is the suspicion justified or is it based on an overactive imagination? Does one destroy someone's reputation or career on mere suspicion? Does one just keep quiet?

Wednesday, August 4

THE APOSTLE: The 2008 movie, directed by Robert Duvall, who also stars in it as an enthusiastic, charismatic, evangelical preacher, who kills his assistant in a fit of rage after discovering his own wife is having an affair with the man. He flees punishment to set up a small church in an out-of-the-way Louisiana town, but knows that at any moment the past may catch up with him. The work explores his complex character, opposing his sincere apostolic fervor with his very human passions of sexual desire and anger.

Sunday, August 15 after church service with lunch provided at intermission.

<u>THAIS 2009</u>: Metropolitan Opera extravaganza starring Thomas Hampson as an early Christian, cenobitic

monk who leaves his desert retreat to go to the great city, Alexandria, convinced that he can turn the glamorous courtesan (Renee Fleming) from her life of sin and pleasure. The story, based on the novel by Anatole France, opposes the hedonistic and ascetic, the physical and the spiritual, at their most extreme. In addition to great music (Massenet) and wonderful singers in parts seemingly made for their talents, Ms. Fleming's costumes were designed for her by Christian LaCroix, and the Met dancers are extraordinary. As former parishioner Peg Cooper said, it's "everything grand opera should be!"
