Betsy B Kitch, a Biography

I grew up in west-central Illinois in a farm and small town environment. This was interrupted by four years in Arlington VA while my father, James M Byrns was head of the West Central Division of the Dept. of Agriculture. Each summer I managed to get back to Illinois staying with my aunt and uncle there. While there the summer I was 10 I had appendicitis and in the process of waiting for the one surgeon in the county to get back from his farm I had an extraordinary experience of God's presence.

I'm a lifelong Episcopalian, having gone to St. James Church in Griggsville, Ilinois as the fourth generation of our family to worship there. I graduated from Griggsville High School in 1950, and the U of Illinois in 1955 with a major in Microbiology, working as research assistant there until 1956.

John I Kitch jr. and I were married in 1955. 1956-59 found us on Okinawa where Jack was stationed with the

USAF. His next assignment was to teach English at the Air Force Academy in Colorado. A long tour there was interrupted by a year in Vietnam and a return to University of Illinois to complete a Ph.D. in English. We have three living children, David, Bill, & Anne, born in Okinawa, Colorado, and Illinois, and four grandchildren.

While living on Okinawa, I helped start The Craft Center in Nago which was connected with an Episcopal mission church. I secured supplies, taught techniques, and enabled outlets there and in the USA. I continued to support this work when we returned to Colorado and pursued training in spinning and weaving.

In 1972-74 we lived in Elkins W Va. Our children were in grade School, Jr. High, and High School. In addition to supporting them in their various activities I reclaimed my latent interest in hand weaving as a member of the Mountain State Weavers Guild. I assisted in promoting the weaving class for the Augusta Heritage Festival, an annual autumn event. As a family, we were actively involved in Grace Episcopal Church.

We moved to Ohio in 1974 when Jack was stationed at Wright Patt AFB, and have lived in Fairborn and Centerville. My husband retired from the USAF in 1984. We are active members of Christ Episcopal Church, Xenia. I first came to Christ Church around 1980 as a driver for a group of youth visiting churches in the area. I was very impressed by the hospitality I found there. Because we lived in the south end of Fairborn, it was just about as easy to get to Christ Church or St. Christopher's. We found the drive through the countryside to Xenia a pleasant one and have been here ever since.



Pandora's Box

(or, "Lord, protect us from those things that we naively begin without full realization of what we are getting into.")

The community health promoter groups are tackling problems of violence. Most everyone acknowledges that family violence exists in their community, but finding a productive way to address it can be tricky. Each community promoter group is deciding what the best interventions are for their communities.

Most promoter groups are choosing some type of community-wide presentation. Community presentations are simple to organize, require few resources, and can raise issues in a non-threatening manner to get them "out in the open." In general, the community presentations are a "one-way" communication method - the promoters present to community members.

Jesus had a special concern for children, and one group of promoters opted to get involved at the local primary school, focusing on communication skills as a preventive approach. They had been planning to simply make the presentations to the students with a few activities.

But it did not work out quite the way they had anticipated.

The open and personal sharing in the classroom captured the attention of all the students and the promoters were pleased. To the promoters' initial surprise, the process revealed emotional stories of serious family discord and conflict from some of the students. After opening this particular Pandora's Box, the promoters realized that they had to deal with these revelations.

Together with the teachers and the community council, the promoters are working on what they can do to intervene in the worst situations. We at the Clinic are helping with ideas on how to proceed. As I said above, finding a productive way to address these problems can be tricky.

Isaac was impressed, but a little concerned..."But dad, I don't think your computer has enough memory."


