

March Vestry Minutes

Next Vestry Meeting is April 9th




- Meeting called to Order (11:28 – when we achieved quorum) with prayer. Bradley Alexander, Barbara Bonham (junior warden), Tanya Ellenburg-Kimmet (vestry clerk), Cheryl Eskridge, Debbie Gillespie (senior warden), Doug Pultz (treasurer), and Jean Stetzler were in attendance.
- Doug P. made a motion to approve the March minutes; Jean S. seconded. Motion passed. To follow up the minutes, Easter baskets will not be handed out as planned in the minutes. April agenda accepted without vote. Debbie G. explained the Basic Community Needs Assessment Process discussion from March minutes. Team consists of Cheryl Eskridge, Doug Pultz, and Tanya Ellenburg-Kimmet.
- Reports of Officers (Senior Warden, Junior Warden, Treasurer Reports) – reports were posted on Drop Box for April Meeting; Debbie G discussed her report, the offer for Stewardship guidance, the concept of Congregational Formation Gatherings.
- Discussion on Supply Clergy:
 - Advantages: we get amazing people, less expensive, a chance to try out possible prospects, we have Fr. Elaine as a back up
 - Disadvantages: there are cancellations, we don't have a chance to get to know them, it does not give the parish a chance for growth – may indicate the end of the life cycle
- Permanent supply priest/interim priest/transition priest
 - Advantages: the interim priest shakes the church up and prepares them for the incoming priest, consistency
 - Disadvantages: sometimes causes angst and may drive off members, sometimes hard to find, it could be expensive with retirement and insurances (we could only afford a retired part time priest)
 - Merge with a church like Saint Christopher (having a sister church)
 - Advantages: affordable
 - Disadvantages: time change possible, struggle with growth, not having a priest readily available, could wear out the clergy
- Vestry agreed on preference to sharing the priest though also agreed to wait until deciding in the Fall.
- Committee Reports – Posted on Drop Box for April Meeting
- To Do List (2-3 minutes)
- Unfinished and New Business
 - Choir Matters – Jean S. presented for Peg Stockton that she is requesting section leaders for the choir. 1. Hire 3 section leaders at \$150 a week, 2. \$50 a week for just Sophia and \$150 per anthem, 3. \$150-200 per anthem. Barbara B made a motion that we do not need section leaders at this time due the low membership of the choir, Jean S. seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
 - Basic Community Needs Assessment Process/Committee to assess new proposals for church work – need to make sure we have that formed. This committee will address the fishing and disaster proposals.
 - Church Directions/Merger discussion
- Closing Prayer and Adjournment (12:41) Debbie G motioned to adjourn. Cheryl E. seconded.



NEWS FROM THE MINISTRIES

STEWARDSHIP BY BECKY GENTRY

“All things come of thee, O Lord.”
(from God’s Stewards Trust & Share, 1994)

This opening statement of an offertory acclamation describes the first and most challenging step in being a faithful people – that of recognizing how we come to have what we have.

Many of us act as though we have all that we have through our own efforts. But the message of the Creation story and the Christian story is that there is no such thing as a self-made man or woman. We can say we have used our talents wisely and managed our money well, but we cannot say we are self-made. We are God-made, every step along the way; birth, death, beyond. All of our accomplishments and even our access to opportunity rely on God’s gifts.

When we realize this, then we are ready to become stewards. For a loyal steward knows that what he or she has is the result of another’s graciousness. A steward is not the source of the gift, but the manager of it on behalf of another. “All things come of Thee, O Lord” expresses our realization that all that we are and all that we have – life itself, our energy and time, our talents and wisdom, our money and our possessions, our family and friends – is a gift from our Creator. All is gift. This is a radical notion.

It has been suggested that in our society we hold to a belief in God without expressing any need for God. It is one thing to say “I believe in God” and quite another to depend on God. To experience our dependence on God and to celebrate it; to recognize all that we have is through the graciousness of God...that is the beginning of faithful stewardship.

My heartfelt thanks to all for making our past eight months of providing free meals to the community a great success! However, as of now, we do not have any volunteers signed up for our next meal on Sunday, May 21st!

The congregation has been great in volunteering thus far, and our turnout of people coming in to enjoy a good meal has been increasing. For our April meal we had 52 people, our biggest number ever!

We now need volunteers (a team of 6 or so each month) for May through August. (Not to worry: Once a team is formed, it all comes together pretty quickly!) Make this craft to display a bit of springtime year-round!

What you need:

- An old shirt
- Tempura paint (brown, dark pink, light pink and white)
- Paintbrush
- Light blue or white construction paper
- A paper plate
- Q-tips
- Paper towels



What you do:

1. Roll up one sleeve and paint your arm and the palm of your hand brown.
2. Lengthwise on the paper, carefully place your painted arm and hand, with fingers spread apart. (This is the tree trunk and branches.)
3. Place the other paint colors on the plate.
4. Using Q-tips, place dots of paint (blossoms!) all over the branches.
5. When dry, display your tree — or give it as a Mother's Day gift.




