Vestry Highlights

June Vestry Meeting Minutes

- Senior Warden reported on priest search (see below)
- Junior Warden Report discussed work on the Bell Tower. Progress is slow; more damage has been discovered than expected. Contractor had faced personal issues slowing the work as well. Mark discussed how vacations would effect contact with the contractor. Contractor described drainage issues. Mark also met with Jeff Blackaby about Nickel house repairs. Doug P. Suggested sending Chris Hudson up to check on progress.
- Treasurer made his report. Doug reported on banking updates. Doug reported on priest salary options.
- Doug announced that any work must have vestry approval; this is due to buildings & grounds budget issues.
- Search committee for priest has been assembled Elizabeth C. Reported or the Priest search committee, reporting favorably on our candidate. Vestry conducted a round table discussion on the candidate. Further information pending upon processes in motion and outcomes.
- Tanya E-K. brought to the Vestry the request of the Parish Office Administrator for a new computer purchase. The Mac currently in use is outdated, unable to be updated cheaply, and not conducive to the workflow. Joyce G. made a motion to spend \$1000; Lee S. Seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
- Vestry Retreat discussion: Vestry discussed on where to go and when. Discussion on holding it October 19-20. Karen I. will investigate use of Proctor. Barb B. will investigate use of Transfiguration.
- Vestry was reminded that Church picnic at the Thomas' on July 1st.
- Vestry was reminded there will be no Vestry in July.

Work on the bell tower is still in progress. It has been a very slow process with many delays. I discussed this with Greg at Dart Construction yesterday and he assured me that while there have been a few surprises with more damage existing than expected and therefore more work required, that the issues have been worked out and the project is proceeding.

He did inform me that during this time he has had two deaths in the family which has taken much of his time. That along with delays caused by weather has resulted in a much longer time that anticipated to get to completion. I informed him of my plans and let him know that he would not be able to reach me for the next few weeks and if there were any complications he would need to contact others on the list we gave him.

I intend to get one more bid before than, and also let A-Able know we are getting bids and make sure the bid they gave us previously still stands.

I will return from PNG by the 15th of July and will meet with the committee shortly thereafter.



What you need:


- Glass jar
