

Reports of Officers

- Barb B– Senior Warden (2-3 minutes)
 - Priest in charge will start on September 24. She rejected the pay scale in favor of the church.
 - Church Safety: Kitchen, Sacristy, Front door, and Ramp door will be locked at 9:45; latecomers will have to knock. Tool box has been provided by the diocese. Recent dangerous encounters were recounted.
 - Repointing of the Church: They have been working the last few days. We will not pay until Chris Hudson has checked the work. Barb will like three estimates for the repairs in the tower and instead of Greg Dart. Barb will have Becky prepare a thank you note from the Vestry for the gift of the Bell from Greg Dart.
 - Scheduling next meeting vs welcome meal Barb would like to move Vestry to September 30th so Mother Jen. Cheryl made a motion that vestry will be on the 30th of September. Bradley seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
 - Saturday Night AA Meetings Barb B. reported that Jennie attended the most recent meeting and passed on the rules (especially that doors are locked and they leave the church like they find it).
- ◆ Mark C Junior Warden Report was not made.

Treasurer's Report – Doug

- Audit is complete. Doug recommends audit of all books next year.
- There was a mistake of sending a check to Rev. Gartig with only one signature.
- Discussion was held of backing up of files. All finances and vestry documents are already backed up to the cloud.
- Check of remainder from shelter still outstanding Athletes in Action \$123.43
- Grant from diocese is still outstanding. Doug P. calls for committees to gain estimates for point and kitchen repairs. Joyce G. reported steam table would cost \$759.

Committee Reports and Unfinished business

- Cheryl E. reported on meals: picnic, meal on September 23rd, coffee hour.
- Doug P asked about gift for Mother Jen. Karen I. discussed an induction.

New Business

- Karen I. suggested the use of name tags and a dot system to designated services and maybe a contest for wearing them.
- Joyce G. suggested getting a defibrillator. Joyce G. made a motion that after researching and making a decision that we spend up to \$1500 for a defibrillator. Cheryl E. seconded. Motion carried unanimously. Cheryl found someone who could do the CPR class.
- Karen I. suggests we reassess our ministries once Mother Jen is here.
- Church sign is missing due to repairs. Chris Hudson has called reluctantly called it unrepairable. He and Barb B. will contact sign smiths for fix/repair, possibly costing \$2500.
- Mother Lynn's picture needs to be up in the Parish Hall.
- Joyce G. suggested in addition to the steam table, we purchase a cart on wheels with electrical outlets. All of this may not be possible until after the remodel.




The next Vestry Meeting will be September 30th.


