

Reports of Officers

- Senior Warden Report: Barb B. reported she met with Bright Worth Signs; it will be expensive. Timeline appears to be late October/early November. She will pass information on to Mark C.
- Junior Warden Report: Mark C. reported about the bell tower progress. It is proceeding and the work should be finished in the next few weeks.
- Treasurer's Report Doug reported we had gains in the Chamberlain and Nickell Funds for the third quarter. The grant for the bell tower was denied. CECX has other financial avenues that can be used to pay for repairs, so Doug will contact the PNC to request from Hager, Williams, and Nybladh Trusts to move \$90,000 to the account to pay for the repairs. The investment team will meet in October for update on the Nickell Fund. He will recommend that we not accept a distribution in 2019. Pledges are coming in slowly. The budget process has begun; due in November. Confidential gift of thanks for Becky in recognition of her work in between priests.
 - Discussion on gift of thanks for Becky. Joyce suggested \$500. Cheryl E. made the motion to give her \$500, Joyce G. seconded. Motion passed with one vote of nay due to amount being too low.
 - Discussions on getting estimates for repairs on Parish house.

- Cheryl E. researched some on Defibrillators. She reported that we need the ones that vocally guide users, \$2500, an increase from previously voted on purchase amount, with a \$99 a year for 3 years for maintenance. Information will be sent to Tanya for compilation and will be decided in November.
- Vestry will look into a community outreach program on CPR training as well.
- Jennie Hudson has offered to do a opiate addiction presentation for the community.
- ♦ Church Sign see senior warden report
- **†** Kitchen remodel: kitchen repairs will be postponed a year in lieu of HVAC concerns.

- Reverend Jennifer announced she will be gone during October for 2 weeks.

- Rev. Jennifer suggested a longest night service (for grieving and contemplation around December 21st), set tentatively for December 21st as an 1-1.5 hour service with candles and a canvas labyrinth in the Parish hall.
- Discussion on Christmas Eve dinner
- Vestry retreat was moved to January 4-5 at Transfiguration.
- Joyce G. announced that she is supporting the Bible study and discussed the big read that Reverend Jennifer had mentioned that morning in services.
- ♦ Joyce G. also requested that transcriptions of the sermon be placed on the website, both Reverend Jennifer and Tanya E-K. agreed that is possible.
- ♦ Lee S. requested everyone make sure to vote in the upcoming election.

The Rev. Dr. Jennifer Oldstone-Moore, Professor of Religion, at Wittenberg University, Springfield, is married to Christopher Oldstone-Moore. They have three adult daughters, Caroline, 28; Aileen, 25; and Marilee, 22. They reside in Springfield Ohio.


Dr. Oldstone-Moore specializes in Chinese religious traditions, specifically modes of Confucian religiosity, political and social aspects of Confucianism, and the transformation and continuity of the Confucian tradition from imperial to modern China, especially in the uses of both ritual and science. She has published and presented papers on the Confucian New Life Movement, the history of study of East Asian Religions, Daoist allegory and alchemy in the Ming novel Journey to the West, and historiographical issues concerning Chiang Kai-shek. She has also published several books, chapters and articles on Chinese religion for general audiences.

Dr. Oldstone-Moore teaches courses in Chinese and Japanese Religions, Confucianism, Buddhism, Daoism and Chinese popular religion, Pilgrimage, Religion and Literature in East Asia, the Silk Road, and an introduction to East Asian Studies. She earned her B.A. at Swarthmore College and her M.A. and Ph.D. from the University of Chicago.

She joined the Wittenberg faculty in 2000.

Dr. Oldstone-Moore is an ordained priest in the Episcopal Church, and serves St. Anne Church, West Chester, as a Resident Priest. Rev. Jennifer joined CECX as Priest-in-Charge on Sunday, September 23, 2018.

Reflections on 144th Convention of the Diocese of Southern Ohio.—Rev. Elaine Silverstrim

On Saturday, November 3, Doug Pultz, Bradley Alexander, Lee Silverstrim, Mother Jennifer, and I made our way to the tents of Procter Center for the one-day convention. The special offering from the opening Eucharist was designated to Episcopal Relief and Development and Tree of Life Synagogue in Philadelphia. Some of the more interesting challenges included getting electronically connected to the WiFi set up for the event and logging in to cast ballots for the election of Diocesan offices. Sadly, no one was ever able to resolve issues with Bradley's connection. The rains of the previous week required parking at the nearby Middle School and hopping school buses for shuttle to and from the convention. There were other interesting learning experiences, but overall the mood was much like a crowded "family reunion," which is what Diocesan Conventions tend to be.

Three resolutions were passed with little comment. The saddest, was the final resolution for the closing of St. Andrew's parish. Within our own sanctuary we kneel upon the altar cushions given to us in gift and view a second Pascal candle next to our baptismal fount. We carry the memories of that faithful congregation within our sanctuary.

The second resolution sets aside a portion of our "Diocesan Giving" to establish a fund for new church plants, estimating about \$65,000 toward aspiring to seek ways to adapt and grow. These first two resolutions speak directly to the Cycles of Life that we enter into with our baptisms and affirmations of faith.

The budget was passed with little comment. The Report of the Trustees regarding the stewardship of our the gifts and bequests of the Proctors and others is encouraging and impressive.

But the most important resolution is one which will hopefully be the most powerful and enduring of our humble actions at Convention.

The Resolution on "Becoming the Beloved Community" deserves a great deal more conversation and reflection than a simple report. With that said, I will provide a separate report on probably the most important piece of work our little band were part of.

Thanks to the members of the church for the opportunity to attend (on my part observe as non-voting attendee), on behalf of our church.

Reflections and Background: Resolution 2018-03, passed unanimously Nov. 3, 2018 Rev. Elaine Silverstrim

Background:

The 78th General Convention of the Episcopal Church recognized, by adoption of Resolution 2015-2019, that, despite repeated efforts at anti-racism training as well as racial justice and racial reconciliation initiatives – including the passage of more than 30 General Convention resolutions dating back to 1952 – that the abomination and sin of racism continues to plague our society and our Church at great cost to human life and human dignity ... (The National Church) is now charged to account for the Church's work of racial justice and reconciliation. The framework for this work? Becoming The Beloved Community.

To that end a committee was formed in January of this year. The Diocese has received a United Thank Offering Grant to hire personnel to plan training events and to make more resources available to "support communities of practice as they work toward Becoming Beloved Community."


The resolution is something all of us should read. As participants at Convention we were challenged to take time to enter into conversation with other attendees around the Question? "What does 'becoming beloved community' mean to me?" And then we were to write a one word (or phrase) of the characteristic we look for in a 'beloved community.'


The basic resolution addresses a sad fact. For all the distance we might think we have traveled toward honoring, acknowledging and appreciating the dignity of every human being, our efforts have fallen short and our work isn't done. Choosing the word "becoming" over "being" is deliberate. Will we ever fully "be" the community of beloved disciples? "Becoming" means we know the efforts toward that vision, first articulated and lived out by Christ, can never rest.

Only we can provide the answer as to whether this will be one more aspirational resolution or a genuinely "inspirational" kick in a world that needs these endeavors daily.


