### Share 1-to-1 Ministry

The Share 1-to-1 Ministry (Clothes Closet) is quite busy these days. We are very blessed with donations, blessed with volunteers to work at least every Tuesday, blessed to have CECX willing to put up with us, blessed with clients.


One client recently said to me that she is so thankful for us because if it were not for us she would not have any winter clothes. Another client has been getting baby clothes in preparation for the birth of her son expected on December 24. Well, if you watched the TV on December 12 or 13 you saw the woman who gave birth to her son on 12/12/12 at 12:12. That was our client, Destiny.

Our numbers vary from week to week, but one Tuesday Bradley noted that we had almost 70 actual clients visit the clothes closet in that three hour period we are open. That's a lot of bodies in our crowded space. That was not counting the number of people they were getting items for. Some get clothes for friends, relatives, nursing home patients, fellow fire victims, etc. They leave on Tuesday with kitchen trash bags full or regular trash bags full. Yet we have plenty of clothes to give away due to the generous donations of the public. We have given over 200 coats away this year. We have had stuffed animals, books and a limited number of toys to give for Christmas. These folks need household items, bedding, linens, underwear, socks, gloves, hats. You name it and we can use it. Just no large appliances or furniture, please. Although, one volunteer gave us her old dryer. Larry Thomas hauled it to the garage for us and guess who ended up using it. We did, as our dryer in the office recently "died".

Thank you Becky and Mother Lynn for your support and tolerance of us on Tuesdays. Becky also receives donations during the week for us. Bradley Alexander, Michael Taint, and Mark Cummings help us tremendously by carrying bags of clothing up the stairs to the bathroom so we can hang them. Summer helps by spreading the word about us to her Hospice families. Thanks to all of you who bring us item - toys, clothes, bags, etc. I feel very blessed to be a part of this ministry and to have a community and such wonderful people who so willingly share their time, talents and possessions.



### AFTER THE HOLIDAYS – RECYCLE YOUR CHRISTMAS TREE

Since each one has picked a very special live tree to decorate for Christmas, and your celebrations were the most delightful, now we need to consider the best method to extend its usefulness after the holidays.

Perhaps these examples might stir one up to re-cycle more effectively, such as:

- Place the tree in the garden so birds and other wildlife can use the branches for shelter. Spread peanut butter and top with nuts in a pine cone for food.
- Prune the branches for mulch.
- There is no cost to take the tree to the Greene County Environmental Services called the Yard Waste Sites. The tree branches, once pruned, can be no more than four feet long or four inches in diameter. The address of the Yard Waste Site is 2145 Greene Way Boulevard in Xenia.
- Some hunting and fishing organizations collect the trees to provide habitat for wildlife and fish.

Keep recycling.

#### Dear Mamaw:

### Dana Rhyne's Submission

I am writing this letter to you the day before I'm to be confirmed in the Episcopal Church. I suppose Mom & Dad have told you of my decision. I just wanted you to know that you have only yourself to blame! All of my life you have shown me how to be a woman of faith (and I must say you are a hard act to follow!). I have watched you work in the church, you and all the other strong women I grew up with--Lil Stepp, Lillian Holsclaw, Brenda Fox, my mother, just to name a few. And I have watched that same wonderful welcoming church slam its doors in the face of my generation, just because we wanted to follow God all the way to the altar and beyond. At the time I thought, "Fine, I don't think I can ever be other than Baptist, so I'll just put church on the back burner of my life. I don't really feel welcome there with all I have to offer." And I did put church on the back burner.

For a while I attended and even joined the First Baptist Church of Asheville, a nice middle-of-the-road Baptist church. But then the minister let me down (ala Bill Clinton). So I stopped going there. And a precious part of my life was missing.

When we moved up here, I visited the Church of Our Saviour because I knew one of the members (the sister of one of my seminary friends). I went sporadically last year, enjoying the warm, friendly atmosphere, enjoying the new type of service, finding peace in the words of the ancient church. Then I started going more regularly, thirsty for what I had missed during those years away from the church. Then I was asked to supervise Sunday afternoon coffee hour goodies and cleanup. Then I was asked to be the treasurer on the vestry. All the time I was never asked to become an Episcopalian or join the church, just that I be there!

And so I asked myself why it was that I was there so often, when never before have I willingly gone to church "eight days a week & twice on Sundays." I realized that our priest, Mother Paula, while being thoroughly traditional in many ways, had a broad interpretation of Christ's welcome table. Everyone is welcome. Everyone. White, black, man, woman, gay, straight, alcoholic, tee-totaler, everyone. We are all affirmed and prayed for, by the congregation as a whole. And it's not just welcoming words from the priest--everyone at church welcomes everyone else. During the service we "pass the peace of Christ" and we all go and hug or touch everyone in the sanctuary as if we mean it. And we do! I feel Christ's love in that sanctuary, in a way I never have since I was a teenager in a church that hadn't told me yet that I wasn't welcome behind the altar.

Because of that I have decided to join the church. I know it isn't necessary. I know that I am giving up my heritage, a heritage that, while it rejected me, also brought me to Christ. But I would rather start a new heritage in church, than contemplate my old heritage sitting in my living room on Sunday mornings. I am so glad to have found my way again. The least I can do is join the people who held the light before me.

I love you Mamaw, and I hope that you are happy for me. I'll be thinking of you tomorrow, and of all those strong women (and men!) on both sides of my family. I'm doing this because of you all.

### Missionary Report

Anita and Michael Dohn are physicians serving as SAMS missionaries with La Iglesia Episcopal Dominicana at the diocesan Clínica Esperanza y Caridad. They live along the southern coast in San Pedro de Macorís in the Dominican Republic.

### **Kings & the Ecclesiastical Calendar**

The Board of the Clinic met in late November. The Board is less than a year old, having been commissioned by Bishop Holguín at the 2012 diocesan convention here. Meetings have mostly been about getting the Board Members up-to-speed on the Clinic's operations and issues. Ercilia, the Clinic administrator, has also been keen on getting the Board Members to meet the Clinic employees and get involved in some of the Clinic's activities.

At the end of the November meeting, Ercilia invited the Board Members to attend the HIV/AIDS Children's Christmas Party. She explained about the annual event. Participation in the Christmas pageant would be welcomed – particularly if anyone felt called to play one of the Three Kings (we sometimes have trouble finding people to play the three Wise Men).

While Ercilia and I just sat there in amazement, an animated discussion ensued as to whether the Kings even belonged in a Christmas pageant – they are after all more appropriately Epiphany people. Epiphany is a bigger deal here than in the US. It is the day of gift-giving, when the Three Kings bring presents for children and people exchange gifts.

The priests and attorneys on the Board bantered back and forth. The thinking was that Epiphany has its own story and the Kings really belong there. Ercilia and I knew that the Clinic staff was not going to forsake including the Kings in the pageant (their golden, bejeweled "crowns" fashioned from cardboard Burger King crowns from years ago are stored above the health promoter manuals in our office).


The final decision was inconclusive regarding the Kings, but it did seem that Santa Claus might be making an appearance (mostly because one of the Board Members has his own Santa suit).
