Dear Friends,

A recent conversation with a member of our congregation started me thinking about unity and division. The conversation was centered on Holy Eucharist, as clear a mark of unity as I've ever known. Our parishioner and I were in complete agreement about that. Another clear mark of unity is Baptism – God's gracious welcome into the Christ-community here and now. No one is excluded. At least – no one is excluded by God, because God's very nature is unity; the unity of Trinity itself. And the Church—past, present, and future—is often spoken of as the Body of Christ on earth, always meant to be a whole.

This parishioner was grieving over the way we – members of the Body of Christ, and self-proclaimed followers of Jesus – seem so intent on breaking that body and creating division. Even Baptism and Eucharist become marks of division rather than unity, with some excluded from community because "their" Baptism or "their" Eucharist

is somehow different and therefore less than ours. Or perhaps we exclude others from the community and the Table because they do not believe just as we believe, and therefore they must be in error and unacceptable.

I understand our parishioner's grief. I can imagine it's a faint shadow of the grief of our Creator. It has made me so aware of the ways I create division; and has made me resolve to do all that I can to support unity. Race and color, creed and dogma, nationality and social standing, economics and class – we have created divisions from these differences, and we can begin, each of us in our own lives, to wreak havoc upon our divisiveness. We can begin to know God more intimately as we know ourselves to be in unity, one with the other, across time and space. We can lessen the differences themselves as we learn to refuse to assign value to them. We can change our lives, and share that change with those we encounter.

I pray for unity, and the God-life it carries.

In our ongoing effort to develop shared ministry as we aspire to become a Common Ministry Parish, Mother Lynn and the Vestry will be seeking parishioners who will accept the call to the Pastoral Care ministry. 




Make this fun craft to remember our heavenly Creator made.

What you need:

- Adult help
- · Tall chip can with lid
- Hammer and nail
- Acrylic paint; paintbrush
- Water, glitter, white glue Colored tissue paper
- Stronger craft glue < (not hot glue)
- Star stickers or sequins
- Two 4" x 5" pieces of clear Con-Tact paper
- · Scissors; pencil; permanent marker

What you do:

- 1. In bottom center of can, hammer a hole with a nail. Paint outside of can. Let
- 2. Add glitter and a little water to white glue. With a clean paintbrush, glue tissue paper to bottom outside of lid.
- 3. Add stars to sticky side of Con-Tact paper. Place a matching piece on top, sticky sides together.
- 4. Put craft glue along edge of can opening. Glue Con-Tact paper square over opening. Let dry.
- 5. Place lid on can, over Con-Tact paper. Turn lid to get kaleidoscope effect.
- 6. With marker, write "In the beginning ... " on can.

Betsy Byrns Kitch passed away January 13th, 2014 in a car accident.






Both of these people will be greatly missed. Please pray for the ones they left behind.
