
So remember – summer time is still worship time! Bring your hearts and spirits and spend some of the wonderful time God has given us – with God!

- Boy Scouts have begun to meet at the church; Dana Rhyne and Barbara Bonham act as liaison for the meetings.
- Junior warden Lee Silverstrim has asked to be relieved of the position. The Vestry made the choice to choose out of themselves a Junior Warden, and then allow for the person with the most votes from the remainder of the electees not elected in the last election to join Vestry, Bradley Alexander. B. Bonham was elected Junior Warden by acclamation.
- Vestry will review finances at Pentecost and cancel the vestry meeting for the month of July.
- Pam Feinour made a motion to ask Bishop Breidenthal to appoint Mother Lynn's for another year, Dana Rhyne seconded. Motion carried unanimously.
- Simon Kenton will be more long term and stricter on admittance, so Christ Church may be called to continue the winter emergency shelter ministry.

On the 24th:

- L. Silverstrim wrapped up his term with discussion of redoing the floor which the grounds committee will handle. Schedule arrangements will be made to Parish Hall use, Anger Management is only meeting Thursdays, AA will use different area. Suggestion to do this on 1st Sunday in July. L. Silverstrim will discuss with Bob Geyer about widening the entrance. Cost for widening estimates: Floor \$175, wall \$200-500.
- M. Thomas made the motion that Mother Lynn call to get Parish House floors cleaned, P. Feinour seconded. Motion carried.
- Vestry decision to send funds to rescue refugees at sea send \$100 Episcopal Relief Development earmarked for them made by acclamation.
- Brad Alexander has accepted his election to Vestry and will be present at June meeting.
- Welcome Training Mother Lynn will meet with trainers today.
- Treasurer Report about the mission share, the Diocese will be getting back with Doug; Mother Lynn and Doug will meet with Becky Gentry to revalue the form; audit is done and discussion on it is tabled until June.
- Vestry confirmed interest in a work day by acclamation

Israeli Couscous with Almonds and Cranberries

Couscous:

2 Tbsp olive oil

2 C Israeli couscous (or barley or orzo)

4 C veg. broth

1/4 C chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley

1 1/2 Tbsp chopped fresh rosemary leaves

1 tsp chopped fresh thyme leaves—optional (I left out-ML+)

1 green apple, diced (I used red delicious cause I had it)

1 C dried cranberries

1/2 C slivered almonds, toasted, see Cook's Note

Vinaigrette:

1/4 C apple cider vinegar

3 Tbsp maple syrup

1/2 tsp kosher salt

1/2 tsp freshly ground black pepper

1/4 C olive oil

Meetings and Upcoming Events

For the couscous: In a med. saucepan, heat the olive oil on med.-high heat. Add the couscous and cook, stirring occasionally until slightly browned and aromatic, about 3 to 5 minutes. Add the chicken broth and bring to a boil. Simmer for 10 to 12 minutes or until the liquid has evaporated. Transfer the cooked couscous to a large bowl and set aside to cool. Add the parsley, rosemary, thyme, apple, dried cranberries, and almonds.

For the vinaigrette: In a small bowl, combine the vinegar, maple syrup, salt, and pepper. Whisk in the olive oil until smooth. Pour the vinaigrette over the couscous and toss to coat evenly.

Cook's Note: To toast the almonds, preheat the oven to 350 F. Arrange the almonds in a single layer on a baking sheet. Bake 8 to 10 minutes or until golden brown. Cool completely before using.

LETTER TO THE PARISH MEMBERS:

Dear Christ Church,

Our Jr. Warden, Lee Silverstrim, has had to withdraw from his position on the Vestry. Fr. Elaine has found herself a far busier supply priest than she'd anticipated, and Lee, very naturally, would like to travel with her. Given their situation, the Jr. Warden's position has entailed far more time than Lee is now able to give. However, he generously offered to stay in place until Vestry made other arrangements, and that has now been done.

The Vestry has elected Barbara Bonham, a former Jr. Warden, to fill in for a one- to two-year term. The Vestry also decided to modify the Jr. Warden's role for this time period at least. In addition to her role on Vestry itself, Barbara will function primarily as a liaison with the Building and Grounds Team. (Every member of Vestry is liaison with one of our teams/committees, and delivers their group's reports at Vestry meetings.) Mother Lynn and the two Wardens will meet in June with the Buildings and Grounds Team about the leadership of their group, which has always worked hard for the Church.

We thank Lee for his time as Jr. Warden, and especially for the work he accomplished with our heating systems. The costs have been cut dramatically, and while we know this will fluctuate to some degree, we are unlikely to approach the high costs we've had in the past. He'll continue to work with the B&G team whenever the schedule permits, and we're happy to have his talents.


ADVANCE NOTICE - JACK KITCH IS MOVING


