Decision to not reopen the 'Red Door' winter homeless shelter. It has been a process


Undertaken with a great deal of prayer and thought for all concerned.

This project has been years overdue and will be a welcome change.


Buildings and Grounds has had to put off their meeting so no report on their projects.



Call for Medicine Bottles

Do you take prescriptions? If you say no, I bet you are the exception! I have often thought about something to do with all these empty prescription bottles. Now we have an answer. We have been told about an organization called The Links Incorporated, which is an international organization located throughout the world and in 41 of the states. There is a chapter in Wilmington, Ohio. We are going to support a project that this chapter is involved in to help the poorest people throughout the world with their medications. In very poor countries, patients often walk long distances for medical help. They wait hours or days to be treated. They are given medication to tie in a scarf or put in a pocket to carry back to their homes. Few get containers that protect the medicine against accidents, dirt, liquids, or being eaten by animals. We can help by bringing our empty medicine bottles to the Center. We will have a collection box and the Links organization will get the bottles to another organization called Mathews 25 Ministries in Cincinnati who will see that they are sent where they are needed the most in the world. We will start the collection this month and continue it as long as there is interest.



- Clerk's correspondence: Mail from Sierra Club to donate to help dying honeybees given to Barbara B.
- Procedure for calling in civil authorities: Priority basis fires/medical emergencies call 911, building issues call Barbara B. or Pete Sinnott; otherwise call Dana R.
- XAACM meeting with SHALOM: Haven (Paula L.'s project) is in the works; Mother Lynn suggests that CECX offer to take 2-3 weeks of the rotation if the Xenia churches develop a shared shelter.
- Request to Mission Share Formula Task Force Maxine T. made a motion to approve the letter to be sent to Mr. Bolden; Bradley A. seconded; Motion passed unanimously.
- Ongoing Work and Ministry





Have you heard the buzz? Bee populations are dwindling. Why should you care? Our daily activities depend on bees. "They are responsible for pollination of approximately 1/3 of the United States' crop species" (EHSO). "Perhaps 1/3 of our total diet is dependent, directly or indirectly" on pollination by insects. (Delaplane) There are other pollinators, such as butterflies and other flying, stinging, crawling critters. Scientists surmise that "honey bees are responsible for every third bite we eat." (Delaplane). Crops pollinated by bees include "almonds, peaches, soybeans, apples, pears, cherries, raspberries, blackberries, cranberries, watermelons, cantaloupes, cucumbers, and strawberries."(EHSO) Many of these would be possibly pollinated by other insects or other kinds of bees, but not in a commercially sustainable way. It is important that we do our part to help save the bees. Make sure that wasp traps are bee friendly (I have a paper bag bundled up to look like a wasp nest on my porch – the wasps and yellow jackets don't like competition). Avoid toxic bug killers. Also, instead of destroying a nest that you see forming, contact bee keepers. They will gladly come and move the colony for you.

MOTHER'S DAY BY TANYA ELLENBURG-KIMMET



A heartfelt felt heart

On Mother's Day, express your love for your mom or another special woman by giving her this gift from the heart.

What you need:

- Red felt (8" x 11" sheet)
- Dark pen
- Fabric scissors
- Pillow stuffing
- Straight pins
- Embroidery thread (pink, red or black)
- Needle

What you do:
