

As we work, we talk, pray,

ONE-TO-ONE (CLOTHES CLOSET) by Joanne Earley

We are very blessed with donations right now. We have received five vans FULL of boxes of clothing from the Miamisburg Christian Church. They are in the process of clearing out and restocking and switching over from summer to winter. They didn't want to refuse donations so they decided to accept them and redonate. They chose us. Now our garage is full and so is the office basement.

We also are attempting to box summer clothes to make room for winter clothes. Our problem is we have no space to put the summer boxes until we empty some of the winter boxes. Maybe I should have refused this donation.

Their clothing ministry is called Threads. They have a separate building adjacent to the church parking lot that is solely used for Threads. In addition they also have a storage POD for off season clothing. Thank goodness we have our shed in which to store our church's lawn equipment, etc. giving us the entire garage for our clothes closet storage.

Both Threads and Clothes Closet have people in need come weekly. Both of us have social workers/school employees/etc. who refer people in emergency situations. Both of us also accept some household items.

We have had some from Family Violence sent to us because they left their situation in a hurry with only the clothes on their back. Just this past Friday (9-19-14) we had a young lady from IHN who needed dress clothes by Monday morning for a new job. We were able to supply her with several articles of clothing Friday. Our problem is that we need plus sizes (1X and 2X) for many of our clients.

Although some Christians steer clear of Halloween, others use it as an evangelism opportunity and provide entertainment alternatives such as harvest parties.



CECX EMERGENCY HOMELESS SHELTER

It's October and I can't believe that the shelter will be opening next month. Over the summer and the last few months, the shelter received a \$2,000 grant from Meijer for supplies. This was the result of a grant submitted by Marlene Elliott, one of our shelter "angels." We also received a \$2,000 donation from an anonymous donor associated with First Evangelical Lutheran Church.

Just last week, we hired two shelter supervisors. Rick Bayless and Paula Tellis will oversee the day to day operations of the shelter. They will each have a 4 day shift along with a volunteer. We are very excited to have Rick and Paula on board. We are also implementing a change to our rules for the guests. The guests will be asked to provide documentation that they are seeking addiction services or paperwork documenting they are working on getting housing. We are hoping that this new change will allow our guests to get the help they need or housing they need more quickly.

Also, our "shelter angels" are planning a spaghetti fundraiser dinner on Friday, November 7. So mark your calendars. Dinners will be \$8. Carryout will also be available. I understand our own Barbara Bradfute will provide beautiful piano music for us that evening, too. We will need some volunteers to serve. So if you are available to help serve, please let me know. Look for more details in the bulletin.

I am pleased and humbled by the support from you and the Xenia community. Thank you as always for being willing to support a ministry that not many others want to take on in their church.

In addition to the meetings being a lot more fun than I thought they'd be, I feel as though we are working hard to ascertain and implement God's will for Christ Church. And while I might feel individually daunted by that task, working toward those goals with a group, and with Mother Lynn's excellent leadership, feels like a blessing.






