

Relation n. - Concise Oxford Dictionary

2. What one person or thing has to do with another, way in which one stands, or is related to another, kind of connection or correspondence or contrast or feeling that prevails, between persons or things.

In three different dictionaries, there was no word "relationships".

Hum, could this be a "made-up" word, perhaps, the word is not there to dissect, but we ALL have relationships. We, none of, us need a dictionary to define our many and varied relationships. Many of our relationships are so personal we do not want to share the details. Perhaps some relationships are out there for the world to see.

In the context of stewardship, how many relationships can we call to mind? Yes, there are the finances of running the church, but I am Not referring to the pledges we fill out every year when a member of the stewardship stands and announces... it is that time of year, again.

A relationship could be totally one sided. Have you ever paid it forward, slipped a 5 or 10 dollar bill to the Kroger checkout, especially good if you can make sure the person following could use a boost? Hold the checker to solemn silence!...at the gas station... or a drive through.



Homemade Cleaning Products Recipage

All-Purpose Cleaner	Put equal parts white vinegar & water in a spray bottle. Add a few drops of lemon juice to make it smell pretty (but don't worry, the vinegar smell dissipates as soon as it dries).		
Carpet Stain Remover	Mix equal parts baking soda (or borax), salt, & white vinegar. Mix into a paste and apply to the stain. Let it dry, then vacuum it up.		
Drain Cleaner	Pour half a cup of baking soda down the drain, followed by half a cup of vinegar. Let it fizz, then flush with hot water.		
Moldy Grout Remover	Mix half a cup of hydrogen peroxide with one cup of water. Spray it on the moldy tiles, let it sit for one hour, then rinse.		
Shower Cleaner	Fill a spray bottle with water and add 5-10 drops of tea tree oil. Keep it in your shower. Shake it up and spray down the walls and curtain after each shower. Replace every other week.		
Toilet Cleaner	Mix 1/4 c. baking soda with 1 c. vinegar and pour the mixture in the toilet basin. Let it sit for a few minutes, then scrub and flush.		
Stainless Steel Polish	Polish stainless steel surfaces with a paste made from vinegar and baking soda, then rinse well.		
Washing Machine Cleaner	To clean hoses and unclog soap scum, pour a cup of vinegar in the washing machine and run a normal cycle with no clothes. It's recommended to do this monthly for a sparkling washing machine.		
Air Freshener	Throw a few cinnamon sticks or cloves in a pot of water and let it simmer on the stove. You could also use any scent of essential oil that you like.

Missionary Report

We Are The Chosen Ones!

It is exciting to have our work recognized for excellence by the Dominican Ministry of Health. We were selected to pilot a medical record system for people living with HIV who are receiving treatment. We were selected because the Clinic's HIV unit is up-to-date in the present national electronic data-base for HIV/AIDS.

The present national HIV/AIDS database is incomplete, full of errors, and rife with discrepancies. In contrast, the Clinic's data has always been accurate and current.

We are told that the present system is apparently too complex for most centers to manage. For example, some units had registered 2,000 patients, but had less than 500 patients when audited. Problems with the list of active patients included multiple registrations for the same patient and failure to remove deceased patients. Which medicines the patients are taking is frequently uncertain in the present database – a big problem for the Ministry of Health as it wants to use the database for ordering anti-HIV medicines and planning future needs.

We will be piloting the new streamlined system while continuing to duplicate entries in the old system. This means that we will have triplicate records on our patients. We rely on "old-fashioned" paper charts because of the frequent electricity outages.

For the Clinic's efforts, the Ministry of Health has provided two new file cabinets, a new computer, and a data entry technician (the technician is temporary for the pilot program, but the Clinic keeps the file cabinets and computer).

One might argue that the Ministry of Health should choose one of the worst centers to pilot the new system to determine how well it works under "real life" conditions. We are committed to quality patient care. We have the resolve to make whatever system work because at some point we know that it does impact the quality of patient care. Whatever improvements in are made in the hardware and software, commitment and resolve are probably not something that can be programmed into the system.
