

Proper 21****Welcome!****Celebrant and Preacher : Father Mike Kreutzer****We *WON'T* stream to Facebook this week.**[Link to Facebook page](#)**“Did Jesus found a church?”**

Garry Wills asks this question in *What Jesus Meant*, a book well worth a read. “Church” is the word used for the Greek *ekklesia* which doesn’t mean a building, but rather “gathering.” When Paul writes a letter—to Corinth, or Rome, or Colossus—he isn’t writing to the leader, or head, or priest-in-charge, but to the gathering. The gatherings don’t have leaders. And the gatherings met in people’s homes, not in a permanent structure. Why would they need something permanent? In Matthew, Jesus says “Where two or three are met together in my name, there am I in their midst.”

Wills—who is Catholic—asks why any of our gatherings need to have teachings or rules about who is in and who is out, who is authorized to lead and who should just listen.

All this made me self-conscious this week, especially when I was at the altar blessing the bread and wine for Eucharist. The Episcopal Gathering teaches that the priest, who has been consecrated by the bishop, who has been consecrated by the Presiding Bishop, and so on is the one with the privilege to be behind the altar. We are 2000 years away from the time of Jesus, and there is something powerful, and maybe necessary, about having some formal structures that we can look to and depend on—kind of like coat hangers to keep clothes in the right shape until they are worn again.

But at the end of the day (as well as at the end of all time), we should look to our Gathering for meeting Jesus. It is in the Gathering that Jesus is present—David lighting his candle for Breanna before the service; friends and new acquaintances nodding to each other and checking in; Altar Guild getting the altar ready and candles lit; Jennifer giving a foretaste of the music to come; Brad in the back connecting with each and every person who comes through; Becky chatting to those passing through the sacristy as the service is over. It is Gathering that we pull ourselves together to take Jesus with us into the world—it is in Gathering that Becky, Barbara, Nigel and Brad prepare to make a take-away meal for friends in Xenia. It was in this week's Gathering, after the Peace, in Debbie's prayer for Chris and my anniversary, that I felt the love and hope of Jesus so alive and so moving—reminding of the great blessings I know today and through the years. It is in the Gathering that the church is like a ripe seed pod, the seeds spread so widely as we disperse and take the experience of Jesus with us into the wider world, whatever may come and whomever we may meet.

May your week be blessed by the presence of Jesus in your Gathering and your gatherings—

Third Dose For Immune-Compromised Individuals Available at GCPH

Greene County Public Health (GCPH) is providing the 3rd dose of the COVID-19 vaccine only to those individuals who are immune-compromised who have had either Pfizer or Moderna. At this time, it is not recommended for an additional dose for those who received the J&J vaccine.

- Active treatment with high-dose corticosteroids (20 milligrams or more of prednisone daily or an equivalent) including:
 - alkylating agents
 - antimetabolites
 - cancer chemotherapeutic agents classified as severely immunosuppressive
 - transplant-related immunosuppressive drugs
 - tumor-necrosis (TNF) blockers
 - other biologic agents that are immunosuppressive or immunomodulatory
- Advanced or untreated HIV infection
- Moderate or severe immunodeficiency such as DiGeorge or Wiskott-Aldrich syndrome
- Received a CAR-T-cell or hematopoietic stem cell transplant and are within two years of transplant or taking immunosuppression therapy

- Received a solid-organ transplant and are presently taking immunosuppressive therapy
- Undergoing cancer treatment – solid tumors and hematologic malignancies

GCPH holds a COVID-19 vaccine clinic on Thursday of each week from 2:00 – 3:30pm at its main office located at [360 Wilson Drive](#) in Xenia. You can visit [this website](#) to schedule a time, or simply stop by our clinic on any Thursday during the above hours. Be sure to bring your COVID-19 vaccination card with you to your appointment. 
