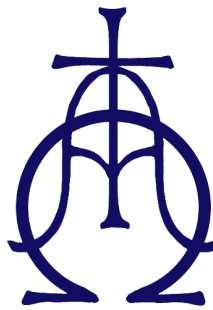
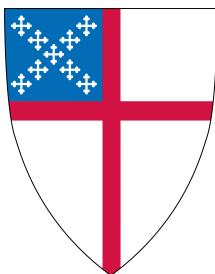

Dear Friends:

In thinking about the joy of Presence—the joy that Paul knew even in prison, facing death—my mind kept returning to one of my favorite prayers in the BCP. On p. 461, in the section called “Ministration to the Sick” is a series of prayers that may be of benefit to a person who is ill. One reads as follows:

This is another day, O Lord. I know not what it will bring forth, but make me ready, Lord, for whatever it may be. If I

am to stand up, help me to stand bravely. If I am to sit still, help me to sit quietly. If I am to lie low, help me to do it patiently. And if I am to do nothing, let me do it gallantly. Make these words more than words, and give me the Spirit of Jesus. Amen.

I think a lot these days of the fleeting and changeable gift of health—the changeability of almost all gifts and circumstances—and how much the turning and tuning of our hearts and minds shape our experience. In Sunday's sermon, I told story about a friend and her young son going to confession and feeling "brand new" after; another story that kept recurring to me was from another friend and her father at the other end of life. He had become blind, and it was difficult for him to move at all. He was calm: his work had become to pray for those he encountered, and he did so with purpose and confidence. I often pray that whatever my circumstances may be that I may be so blessed as to find my home and my work in that moment, however humble or confusing it may be.

An Important Message from Rev Jen

Dear Friends:

It is with a heavy heart that I write this difficult note to you. My last Sunday at Christ Episcopal Church, Xenia, will be January 2, 2022; I will finish my work with you at the end of the Christmas season on January 5.

I love the rich life and community that we have shared for more than three years, being so fortunate to combine serving Christ Church and teaching at Wittenberg. However, things have changed so much at Wittenberg that in 2020 I decided it was time to retire from the university. Not long after I began to prepare to leave Wittenberg, we learned that Chris would lose his job at Wright State.

In the midst of these unexpected and unwelcome changes, we realized that it was time for me to begin full-time ministry, while Chris also seeks new

professional opportunities. In our months of discerning the various possibilities for the future, we decided that we would start over closer to family. In April, I will begin a call at St Andrew's Church, Greencastle, Indiana.

It has been a difficult process as I have had to reckon with leaving this lovely community and each of you. This has been a place of growth, sharing, and love that I will continue to cherish. We have weathered some difficult losses together, and the unprecedented challenges of the COVID quarantine from which our church has recovered much better than many other parishes. I hold each of you individually, and this community, in my heart and continued prayers.

In the last year, Father Mike Kreutzer and Rev. Steve Cuff have become welcome faces to you both in our on-line church and in person. They will continue to serve Christ Xenia most Sundays, including taking on important services in Lent, Holy Week, and Easter Sunday, and for some Sundays into the summer. They will also provide pastoral care and services. I've talked to the diocesan transition team and they will be in touch with Vestry and church leadership to help you find a new priest.

Christ Xenia has a strong staff, Vestry, and a seasoned and able congregation. I relish your wonderful spirit and connection with each other, and know that you will continue to be leaven for change and compassion in the city of Xenia and the surrounding area. And as we move forward, you will be in my heart and in my prayers.

New COVID Booster Guidelines per the State of Ohio

On October 22nd, the Ohio Department of Health released its guidelines to medical providers about the shots.

Booster shots for the Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson vaccines were authorized for people ages 18 and older under certain conditions on Thursday.

The state said no one under that age should take a booster vaccine.

The state said those who received a Johnson & Johnson vaccine are allowed to get their second shot at least two months following the initial dose.

For those who received the Moderna or Pfizer vaccine, there's a few more guidelines. Those eligible for a booster shot must have received their second dose at least six months and meet any of the following criteria:

- 65 years and older
- Those 18 and older who live in long-term care settings
- Those 18 and older who have underlying medical conditions
- Those 18 and older who work or live in high-risk settings

For now, those who have taken a Pfizer/Moderna vaccine should not exceed three total doses.

When and where can you get a booster shot?

Eligible Ohioans can get their booster shots immediately. Those wanting to get the shots can most likely find them at pharmacies, federally qualified health centers, doctor's offices and other locations.
